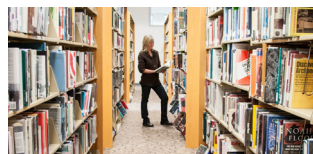

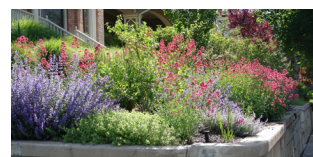

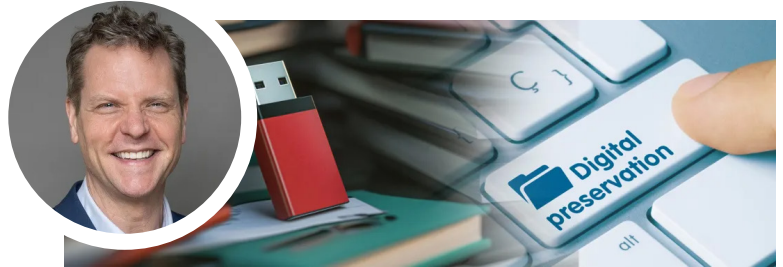

DIGITAL VELLUM: HOW CAN WE AVOID THE COMING DIGITAL DARK AGES



How can we make sure today's photos, documents, and digital memories are still around in the future?

Join us on Thursday, August 21, from 6 to 7 pm at the City Council Chambers for a free talk with Michael Witmore, former Director of the Folger Shakespeare Library in Washington, DC. Now a Longmont resident, Witmore works with internet pioneer Vint Cerf on ways to protect important digital materials — from personal files to cultural and historical records.

Unlike printed books that last for centuries, digital files can disappear quickly. This talk will explain what's at risk and how we can preserve what matters.

Keep Cool, Longmont!

Summer heat is here! With a few smart choices, you can stay safe, cool, and comfortable. If you're working or playing outdoors, start by drinking plenty of water, wearing lightweight clothing, and avoiding the hottest part of the day (usually between 3-6pm).

At home, try cooking, doing laundry, or running the dishwasher early in the morning or later at night to keep extra heat out of your space. An energy assessment can find where cool air is escaping from your business or home—and offer solutions to improve comfort and lower your energy bills.

According to the latest ratings from the American Public Power Association, a typical Longmont Power & Communications customer can go for more than two years without seeing a power outage. The data also found that when outages do happen, LPC crews typically have the lights back on within 42 minutes.

That's probably not a surprise to Longmont's residents and businesses, who have used that reliable power to build and enhance the community since 1912.
