New Utility Billing System Launching in Early 2026

The City of Longmont is launching a new Customer Information System in late January or early February of 2026. This means all utility customers will receive a new account number.

You do NOT need to take any action to create a new account, but please keep track of your new account number when it arrives for your personal records.

If you have automatic payments through your financial institution, please make sure to update this information with your new account number.
