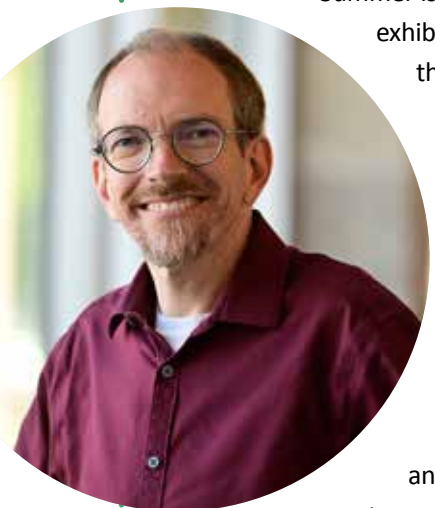
MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

EXPANSION UPDATE

It is with immense gratitude that we are able to announce the completion of the Longmont Museum capital campaign!

Thanks to your support, we have raised more than \$10.2 million to completely fund the construction of the building expansion.

When we kicked off this campaign in August 2023, we knew that our community was in need of a local Museum that would have:

- A dedicated space for children, featuring imaginative and interactive play spaces like Deep Sea Diner, Calming Cave and Sky Castle
- A new special exhibit gallery, nearly double in size, providing more room for artists, accommodating multiple exhibits simultaneously, and hosting more robust touring exhibits
- A more accessible entrance and larger, light-filled lobby
- An expanded courtyard to host summer concerts, galas and summer camps

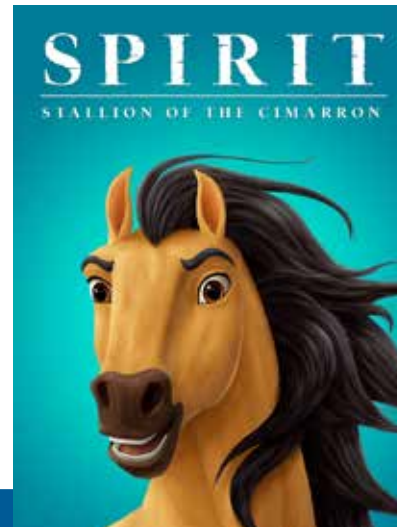

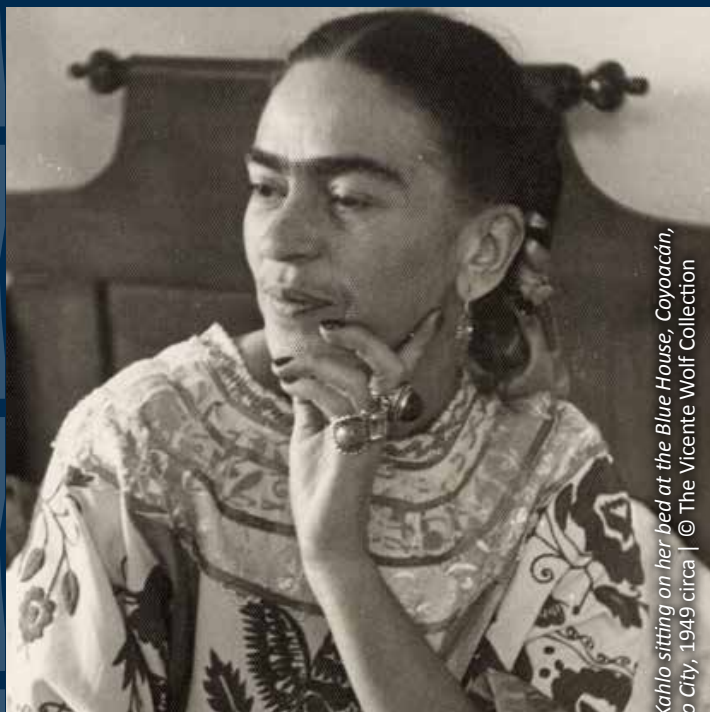
LUNCH BUNCH & FLEXIBLE PICK UP/DROP OFF

“FRIDA KAHLO – AN INTIMATE PORTRAIT”

Explore our new galleries with this exhibition, providing a rare and moving insight into the personal life of one of the 20th century’s most iconic artists. Through 98 photographs selected from her private albums, “An Intimate Portrait” allows us to see Frida Kahlo (1907–1954) through the eyes of friends, family (including her father, professional photographer Guillermo Kahlo), and other noted photographers. Like all family albums, these photographs tell a story: they illuminate her turbulent marriage to famed muralist Diego Rivera, commemorate friendships and happy times, and chronicle her pain. The photographs are also evidence of the way Kahlo crafted and refined her world-famous image.
